Scientific publishing during the COVID-19 pandemic

As we bring the year to a close, the PJHRD is pleased to present this last issue for the year 2021, alongside an online supplement of thematic papers on COVID-19 (https://pjhrd.upm.edu.ph/index.php/main/issue/view/32). The latter is a follow-through to the first COVID-19-related collection published last year.
